# Message from Our Leadership



Dear Friends,

It's no secret that the last year has been tough on pretty much everyone. Although our office doors have been closed for much of the year, the dreams of people with Down syndrome are <u>NOT</u> on hold. Even in the midst of a pandemic, DSAW has taken to new heights.

In March 2020, DSAW launched a brand new virtual education program called **DSAW Connects**. Now we are able to reach anyone in the state who has an internet connection. Since the program's inception, DSAW has hosted over **2,000 hours of virtual programs**. Although we are a local organization, we welcomed **44,000 unique visitors form 99 countries** worldwide to our website. In 2020, DSAW staff provided **900 hours of job coaching and 109 hours of soft skills employment training**. We sent out **71 New Parent Welcome Baskets and Expectant Parent Packs**, and we started a virtual Prenatal Diagnosis Support Group. In the last few years, we have significantly increased our direct services for children and adults of all ages. In 2020, DSAW provided **10,970 hours of direct services** to people with disabilities. WOW!!




