Dear Friends,

What an exciting year it has been for the Down Syndrome Association of Wisconsin! With your help, we have been working to change the lives of our friends with disabilities across the state.

In 2023, we accomplished some amazing things together. Last year alone, we provided over **40,000 hours of direct services to people with disabilities**. That includes **20,897 hours of daily living skills training** and **7,000 hours of job support services to our participants in their jobs!** Although we are a local organization, we welcomed **66,000 unique visitors from 99 countries** worldwide to our website. We sent out **58 New Parent Welcome Baskets and Expectant Parent Packs**, and we welcomed over **6,000 walkers and 300 teams to 8 Down Syndrome Awareness Walks** across WI. We also awarded **48 enrichment grants to families in need**.

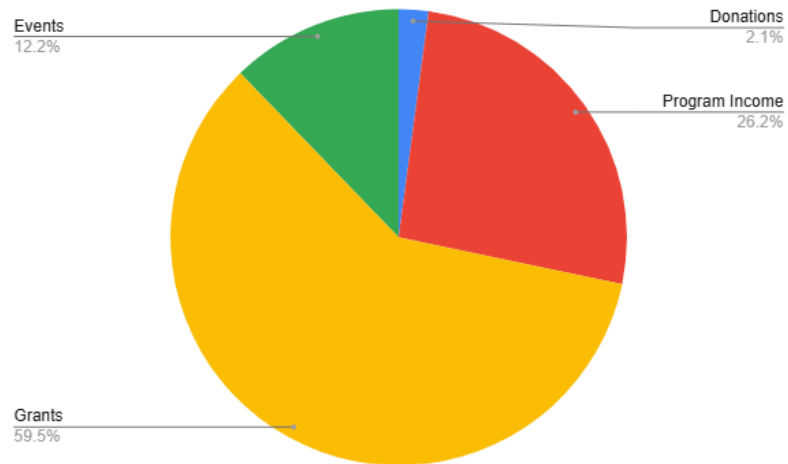

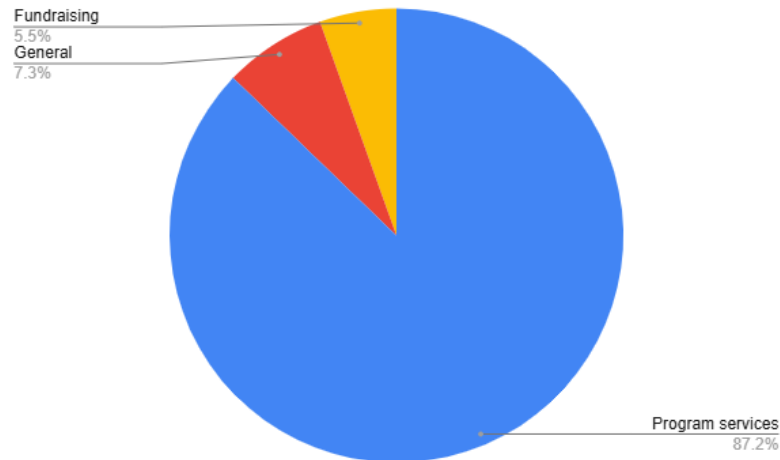
Total assets:
